9 A.M to 5 P.M	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The College was re-accredited by NAAC in its 2nd Cycle with Grade B+ (CGPA 2.68) on 29 August 2024, with a validity period of five years. • The existing infrastructure and instructional facilities are inadequate to cater to the growing number of students and staff members, necessitating expansion and upgradation. • To address infrastructural constraints, the Government of West Bengal has allotted 2.99 acres of land to the College for the development of a second campus at Sahudangi. Initially, the GB has approved for construction of its boundary wall and gate. • The College has separate academic departments, each supported by a departmental library for the academic benefit of both students and faculty members. All departments are equipped with smart boards for ICT-enabled teaching, and six additional classrooms have also been provided with smart boards for Programme course students. • From the academic session 2023–24, the College has implemented the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) with a single major discipline, in accordance with the guidelines of the West Bengal Higher Education Department (WBHED) and the affiliated university. • The College has received provisional affiliation to introduce M.A. programmes in Bengali, English, History, and Political Science, along with a UG programme in BBA (Tourism & Hospitality Management), commencing from the 2024–25 academic session under the self-financing mode. • The college has signed MOU with 7 organizations / industries for providing Internship Programmes to the students as per NEP guideline in different Skill Development Programmes. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The College authority should initiate steps for the creation of new teaching and non-teaching positions to meet the academic and administrative requirements arising from increased student enrolment and the introduction of new programmes. • Construction work at the proposed Second Campus at Sahudangi should commence immediately, with a view to shifting at least one academic stream in the initial phase to ease infrastructural pressure on the existing campus. • The College authority should take necessary measures to establish student hostels, particularly to support outstation and economically disadvantaged students, thereby promoting access, equity, and retention. • The college authority should take necessary steps to increase the pass % in some of the subjects, as the result is poor, like, B.Sc Programme, B.Com Programme, Mathematics (Major).




